




Forbidden Fruit

Part of the tree series, this chandelier began life in a wood. The branch was rescued from a forest clearing that was to be destroyed on a bonfire and after lurking in the Cox studio for some years it was finally immortalised in bronze. The design evolved into this quirky expression of a forest, with moon lit glass balls or mysterious fruit. This piece can be hung in any formation; as a row of branches down a bar or clustered on a round canopy over a dining table. Cox London are happy to produce the perfect configuration for a specific project.

Cast from life, the branches are realised in bronze by the lost wax process, and patinated by traditional torch technique using traditional chemical recipes. The branches are hung from a hand beaten planet of acid etched steel. The glass fruit are free blown in a very light grey glass and lit by dimmable LEDs
